

- 5. Do you think the author proved that God's attributes (love, mercy, and sovereignty) remain intact despite hell being a reality?
- 6. The Divine Promulgation View of Hell is a fresh view that the author has put forth to respond to hell's doctrine. Did the author explain this view well?
- 7. If you were in a conversation about God and hell with an unbeliever or someone who thought God was at fault for hell, would you use the Divine Promulgation View of Hell to prove God is not immoral?
- 8. The author used the Divine Promulgation View of Hell to respond to several objections to hell. Do you think this view successfully responds to these objections?
- 9. The author believes that the Divine Promulgation View of Hell offers a hopeful way to converse on hell's topic so that the discussion can continue and more people can receive salvation from hell. Did the author successfully demonstrate this belief?
- 10. Has this book changed or impacted your perspective about God? About hell?
- 11. How would you briefly describe the book to a friend?
- 12. If you could ask the author a question, what would you ask?
- 13. If you could write one more chapter after the ending, what would you write?
- 14. Would you read more books from this author?
- 15. Would you recommend this book to other readers? Why or why not?
